



COVID-19 Declaration of Compliance

WARNING! ALL INDIVIDUALS ENTERING THE FACILITY AND/OR PARTICIPATING IN SANCTIONED ACTIVITIES MUST COMPLY WITH THIS DECLARATION

North Bay Curling and Athletic Corporation, Northern Ontario Curling Association, and Ontario Tennis Association (collectively the "Organization") require the disclosure of exposure or illness in order to safeguard the health and safety of all participants and limit the further outbreak of COVID-19. This Declaration of Compliance will be kept safely, and personal information will not be disclosed unless as required by law or with your consent.

An individual (or the individual's parent/guardian, if the individual is younger than the age of majority) who is unable to agree to the terms outlined in this document is not permitted to enter the Organization's facilities or participate in the Organization's activities, programs, or services.

I, the undersigned being the individual or the individual's parent/guardian (if the individual is under age 18), hereby acknowledge and agree to the terms outlined in this document:

1. The novel coronavirus, COVID-19, has been declared a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization and COVID-19 is considered extremely contagious. The Organization has put in place preventative measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19 and requires all individuals (or their parent/guardian, when applicable) to adhere to the compliance standards described in this document.
2. The individual has not been diagnosed with COVID-19; OR if the individual was diagnosed with COVID-19, the individual was cleared as noncontagious by provincial or local public health authorities prior to the date this Declaration of Compliance was agreed upon.
3. As of September 22, 2021 the individual will not attend the Organization or any of its activities unless they are fully vaccinated against COVID-19: OR have been approved for exemption for medical reasons; OR are under 18 years of age and are actively participating in organized sport. See section 12 & 13 for details on self-isolation instructions for those who are fully vaccinated.

An individual is considered fully vaccinated if they have received:

- a) Received the full series of a COVID-19 vaccine as authorized by Health Canada, or any combination of such vaccines,
 - b) One of two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine not authorized by Health Canada, followed by one dose of a COVID-19 mRNA vaccine authorized by Health Canada, or
 - c) Three doses of a COVID-19 vaccine not authorized by Health Canada; and
 - d) Received final dose of the COVID-19 vaccine at least 14 days ago.
4. The individual has not been exposed to a person with a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19, or received a COVID Alert exposure notification on your cell phone within the last 10 days of visiting the Organization.



5. The individual is attending or participating voluntarily and understands the risks associated with COVID-19. The individual agrees to assume those risks, including but not limited to exposure and being infected.
6. The individual has not, nor has anyone in the individual's household, experienced any signs or symptoms of COVID-19 in the last 10 days (including fever and/or chills, cough or barking cough [croup], shortness of breath, decrease or loss of taste or smell, muscle aches/joint pain, extreme tiredness).
7. If the individual experiences, or if anyone in the individual's household experiences, any signs or symptoms of COVID-19 after agreeing to this Declaration of Compliance, the individual will immediately isolate, notify the Organizations' General Manager, and not attend any of the Organization's facilities, activities, programs, or services until: they receive a negative COVID-19 test result and are cleared by the North Bay Parry Sound District Health Unit (the Health Unit) from self-isolation, OR they receive an alternative diagnosis by a health care professional, OR it has been 10 days since their symptom onset and they are feeling better. Please see the Health Unit instructions on Self-Isolation if you are unable to self-isolate in the home away from the symptomatic individual.
8. The individual must not attend the Organization's facilities if they, or if any member of the individual's household, has returned from travel outside Canada for 14 days. Unless the individual has been granted an exception from the Government to leave the home for essential purposes such as attending work or school.
9. The individual will follow the safety, physical distancing, and hygiene protocols of the Organization.
10. This document will remain in effect until the Organization, per the direction of the provincial government and provincial health officials, determines that the acknowledgements in this Declaration of Compliance are no longer required.
11. The Organization may remove the individual from the facility or from participation in the activities, programs, or services of the Organization at any time and for any reason if the Organization believes, in its sole discretion, that the individual is no longer in compliance with any of the standards described in this document.

Self-Isolation requirements for those who are fully vaccinated against COVID-19:

12. In accordance with the Health Unit, individuals with no symptoms, or household members who are fully vaccinated and who are a close contact of someone who tested positive for COVID-19:
 - a) are not required to self-isolate at home or in the community, unless directed to by the Health Unit (e.g., in cases of a possible variant of concern)
 - b) should be tested for COVID-19 if directed by the Health Unit
 - c) are not required to stay home until the person with symptoms tests negative unless directed by the Health Unit
13. If a fully vaccinated individual who is in close contact with a person who tested positive for COVID-19 becomes symptomatic, they must self-isolate immediately and be tested and not attend any Organization activities until they have been cleared from self-isolation from the Health Unit.
